## LANGUAGE





## SPEECH

Correctly produces early sounds like /m/, /b/, and /d/

Speech may not always be clear (Example: "du" for "shoe" or "dah" for "dog") but typically is understood by parents or close family members



## SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL

Notices when others are hurt or upset (Example: pausing or looking sad when someone is crying)
Looks at caregiver's face to see how to react in a new situation
Repeats actions that made someone laugh
Engages in parallel play
Imitates adult behaviors in play
Exhibits verbal turn-taking
Engages in simple pretend play, such as talking on a telephone
Talks to self during play

Note: these milestones are meant to be a helpful resource to provide you with a general sense of how most children develop. However, they do not always account for individual differences such as neurodivergence and culture. These lists should be used to identify areas in which a child needs support to navigate their environment with ease and functionality, and not as absolute goalposts.





Gives up the bottle
Scoops food with a spoon and brings to mouth with spillage
Swallows with lip closure
Self-feeds frequently
Chews a broad range of food
Chews on both sides of the mouth
Has precise up/down tongue movement
Drinks from a straw without help and without spillage
